Off course he did told us what was wrong with it, but we were clueless. We made it home safely that day.

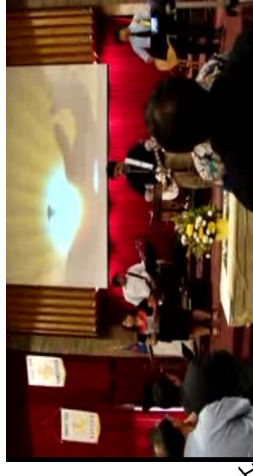
