Pray and Wait on the Lord

My name is Sheng Vue and this is my testimony about how I prayed and waited on the Lord. I got married at very young age. I remembered my very first prayer was for God to protect and guide our marriage and that my husband and I would come to know the Lord personally. When I finished my prayer I realized that he was already sleeping. I thought to myself, "maybe I had been praying too long."

As newlywed, we started going to church every on and off. As the year went by we became parents and so he stopped going to church with me. My children and I continued to go alone. I watched other families, husband, wife and children filling up the pews around us. I tried not to feel resentful about it.

Many people asked why my husband wasn't with us at church. Many times I make up an excuses. Sometimes they said things to make me feel sad and insecure. Their words hurt me deeply. I felt like a knife penetrating through my heart. One occasion someone told me that my children and I should not go to church if my husband wasn't going with us. I replied with a smile that we are all worthy in the eye of our Lord Jesus Christ. Whether my he chose to go to church with us or not that is his decision. We will continue to go without him.

As years passed, he and I started to have issues about going to church on Sunday. I felt helpless. I couldn't transform his heart. No matter how hard I tried to get him to know Christ, it wasn't working. I was tired of the tension at home, especially on Sunday mornings.

Every Sunday as I sat in the pew and counted the couples, I couldn't help but think, "why did God do something about it? Why He didn't change my husband's heart so that he can go to church with us?" Of course, the answer was that God was doing something on His own time. "No one can come to Christ unless the Father who sent me draws him..." (John 6:44). This verse comforted me, that when the time comes God will bring my husband to know Him.

While attending church, I heard the pastor preached about the unequal yoke that a Christian should not married to a non-Christian. I have so many unanswered questions. I couldn't expressed my thoughts to anyone. Even though I was feeling hopeless I've never given up. I continued to pray for him and for my children.

Than one Sunday the pastor preached his sermon on Luke 18:1-8, Parable of the persistent widow. He explained "this widow kept coming to the judge for justice against her adversary. For some time the judge refused her. As she continue to come, the judge finally granted justice for her because she kept on bothering him. In verse 7-8, Jesus said, "And will God bring about justice for his chosen ones, who cry out to him day and night? Will he keep putting them off? I tell you, he will see that they get justice, and quickly." While hearing this sermon, I felt the Lord was speaking to me.

Before I actually see answer to my prayers, God allowed illness into our lives. At 8 years old our daughter was diagnosed with Myelodysplastic Syndrome. I asked God all kinds of

questions, why?????

In the midst of it all, my pain, my stress, and my suffering all alone, God revealed to me that this was the beginning stage of my prayer being answered. I couldn't believe but accept it with gladness and faith wholeheartedly. I didn't know that when our hearts were hardened, God needed to break it for us, so that we could be humbled and learned to depend on Him for trust and hope. For the first time, I saw my husband prayed to God and trusted in Him with all his heart.

As time went by, God directed our path to the Warren Hmong Alliance Church. On Sunday morning on Mother's Day 2000, my husband asked me to get the children ready for church. Since we were church hopper, I asked him "which church?" He said "just get ready." So I did. As we pulled into the church parking lot, my heart jump for joy. I felt like I was coming home for the first time in 17 years. My Father was standing at the door waiting for me. I felt the overflowing of joy in my heart, "Welcome home my child".

During service I sang and worshipped the Lord with all my heart that morning. Every songs we sang, I poured out my heart to Him in tears. After the service, our family went to McDonalds for lunch. I could not stop smiling. My family asked me "Why are you so happy today?" I told them that my Lord God has answered my prayers. Today we are active members of the WHACH and my daughter is free from Myelodysplastic syndrome.

Praise God!

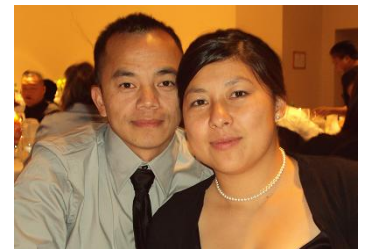

Recipe of the month: Taro Yam Naab Vaam

Ingredients

1 gallon of water
1 can of condense milk
1 medium taro yam
1 bag of tapioca ball (small kind)
2 cans of coconut milk
Sugar (add to your taste)

Directions:

1. Heat water until boil.
2. Cut the yam into bits size.
